



I began coming out at the age of 17, in 1969. Homosexuality was then totally illegal in Victoria. You could be jailed and be forced toundergo psychiatric treatment.

There were no gay helplines ororganisations. I suggested setting up a gay campaign group. All myfriends thought I was mad. So I began challenging homophobia by writing letters to the Herald and Sun newspapers. At first, I was scared to sign my name. I feared the editors might turn me in to the police. Forty years later, Melbourne is a different world, thanks to the efforts of countless queers who fought for justice.

Celebrate and enjoy the victories won, and keep pressing for the freedoms yet to come.







Ian Davey's exhibition '9 Days in Jogya' responds to the extreme contradictions and complexities of Indonesian culture and life. Davey chose Jogyakarta because it is one city in Java that still has an intact history of traditional Islamic life, and displays that fundamentalism and tradition are usually at either end of the spectrum.

J Kristensen, Androgyny

Kristensen explores the diversity of gende gender recognition and association through the use of graphic iconic images that we have come to expect from this outstanding artist.

Michael Brady, RAWHIDE

Dawkins spent ten years writing the emotional landscape in the form of erotic short stories that moved from Australia to San Francisco and beyond. In 2004 she travelled to Germany and Iceland.
